

**Analysis of Brownfield Cleanup Alternatives, Airfield Neighborhood Park**



NOTICE IS HERBY GIVEN that the City of Santa Rosa makes publically available the *Analysis of Brownfield Cleanup Alternatives for Airfield Neighborhood Park (ABCA)*. The Airfield Neighborhood Park project was approved by the City Council on April 8, 2008. The US EPA is assisting the City of Santa Rosa with the costs associated with removing hydrocarbon affected soils at the site prior to construction of the park. As part of the requirement for using the Brownfields Clean-up Revolving Loan Program, the US EPA requires that the neighborhood be advised of the alternatives that were considered for addressing soil conditions. The City would like to share its process of working with the Santa Rosa Fire Department to develop the *Report of Investigation and Soil Management Plan and Excavation Work Plan*, prepared by EBA Engineering (June 2007). The alternatives considered for addressing hydrocarbon affected soils are summarized in the *Analysis of Brownfield Cleanup Alternatives (ABCA)*, prepared by EBA Engineering (November 14, 2008). The ABCA is available for public and agency review for 14 days, from November 25 through December 9.

Copies of the *Analysis of Brownfield Cleanup Alternatives for Airfield Neighborhood Park and the Report of Investigation and Soil Management Plan and Excavation Work Plan* are available for public review at the City of Santa Rosa Public Works Department, 69 Stony Circle, Santa Rosa; the City of Santa Rosa Economic Development and Housing Department, 90 Santa Rosa Avenue, Santa Rosa; and, at the Reference Desk of the Sonoma County Library, 3<sup>rd</sup> and E Streets, in downtown Santa Rosa.
